TO QUALIFY FOR THE ACCESS TO MSIDE PROGRAM, YOU MUST:

- Apply as a first-time, full-time undergraduate student for 2024-2025
- Complete the FAFSA*
- Be admitted to Morningside University****

IF YOU MEET EACH OF THESE REQUIREMENTS. YOU WILL RECEIVE:

- \$24,000/year if you are an on-campus or resident student**
- \$18,000/year if you are an off-campus or commuter student**/***

- March 1, 2024 Application Deadline
- April 1, 2024 FAFSA & Campus Visit Deadline
- May 1, 2024 Deposit & Decision Deadline
