WHAT IS THE MORNINGSIDE PATHWAYS PROGRAM?

PARTNERSHIP

The Morningside Pathways (MP) program is designed to create a seamless path from Western Iowa Tech Community College (WITCC) to Morningside University for students who wish to continue their education and obtain a bachelor's degree. MP provides participating students with a clear academic roadmap that prepares WITCC students for continued study at Morningside while enabling them to complete their degree in a timely fashion. Benefits of the program include early commitments from admissions and financial aid, as well as timely registration and on campus housing selection to help support a smooth transition. Additionally, MP students will have access to Morningside faculty, staff, and students throughout the program.

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

- Students must complete an Associate of Arts (AA) degree in Agricultural Education from WITCC.
- Students must earn at least a 2.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale to transfer.
- Up to 70 academic credits will transfer from WITCC to Morningside.
- A minimum of 124 credits are required to graduate from Morningside University, including the 70 credits from WITCC.

CO-CURRICULAR

MP students have the opportunity to participate in a number of performing arts activities at Morningside. Students are encouraged to become involved by auditioning or attending any of the numerous events held on campus throughout the year.

ORIENTATION TO MORNINGSIDE

Orientation marks an exciting point on the pathway to Morningside, and it will begin as students conclude their coursework at WITCC. Orientation at Morningside includes a combination of both on-campus and virtual experiences where students will have the opportunity to take part in career planning workshops, take advantage of new learning tools, as well as participate in campus events.

MP GRANT AND FINANCIAL PLANNING

In an effort to make the transition easy for MP students, the Morningside Office of Student Financial Planning will develop a financial plan that will assist each student in understanding how best to optimize available resources to invest in his or her college education. In addition to the generous scholarship opportunities available to transfer students (see page 3), fulltime MP students will receive a \$2,000 annual MP grant when they enroll at Morningside. The grant is renewable as long as the student remains full-time. A schedule of deadlines, supported by periodic group meetings and the availability of Morningside financial aid staff for individual counseling, will be established for each MP student.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Interested in the Morningside Pathways program? Students can apply for the program as early as the end of their first semester at WITCC. It is highly recommended that students apply for admission into the program no later than the end of their first year at WITCC. PRAXIS

Morningside students must make formal application to the Teacher Preparation program. One of the criteria for admission is basic skills proficiency as demonstrated by passing the Praxis Core Academic Skills Test for Educators. Morningside's minimum score requirements are 156 in Reading, 162 in Writing and 150 in Math. WITCC students are encouraged to schedule the Praxis Core Academic Skills Test for Educators prior to enrolling at Morningside University. Students may schedule the test at www.ets.org. Students who have passed two of the three Praxis Core Academic Skills Test for Educators will be allowed to enroll in EDUC 300, but must pass all three tests in order to be admitted to the Teacher Preparation program. Admission to the Teacher Preparation Program also includes a background check, personal interviews with two Morningside faculty, and successful completion of EDUC 300 with a C- or better.
