

How do I file a complaint against Morningside University?

The Iowa College Aid Commission is the State Agency that accepts student complaints for students who are attending an Iowa College or University. The Iowa College Aid Commission can be reached via phone at (877) 272-4456 option 4 or you may file a complaint electronically at <https://iowacollegeaid.gov/StudentComplaintForm>.

You should address complaints to local or state officials. First address your public school complaint to the [local school district](http://nces.ed.gov/ccd/districtsearch/) (<http://nces.ed.gov/ccd/districtsearch/>) and then to the [state department of education](http://www2.ed.gov/about/contacts/state/index.html) (<http://www2.ed.gov/about/contacts/state/index.html>).

How do I file a complaint against a school or college?

Colleges and universities operate independently, although they have some state supervision. If you have complaints against a post-secondary institution contact the [state department of higher education](http://www2.ed.gov/about/contacts/state/index.html) (<http://www2.ed.gov/about/contacts/state/index.html>) for help with resolving the complaint.

For issues about financial aid, fraud, waste or abuse of federal funds, special education or civil rights contact the U.S. Department of Education. Listed below is contact information for these issues:
